Body Image

Philosophers have debated the relationship between mind and body for centuries. Today mind, as a subject of study, has given way to personality, a term no less vague, perhaps, but much more popular. Psychologists translate the old mind-body dichotomy to ask whether personality affects the body, whether the body affects personality, and which one wins.

Our answers are only slightly more satisfying than the ones the Spartans had. But at least we are aware that there is a relationship: we know that the body does not exist apart from the psychology. We have become more aware of the ways in which we use and abuse our bodies. Recently too we have learned that different personality traits, physical characteristics and abilities, and reactions to stress all affect susceptibility to illness, self-esteem, chances for success, happiness.

We are that much ahead of the Spartans, perhaps, but many questions remain. The research is sketchy, generally limited to college students. *Psychology Today* readers and editors have been invited to provide information and facts in an area ruled by hearsay and speculation.

The invitation came from three social scientists who want the PT community to help create the first large body of data on body image. The three are Ellen Berscheid, professor of psychology at the University of Minnesota, Elaine Walster, associate professor of sociology and chairman of the department of sociology at the University of Wisconsin, and George Bohrnstedt, associate professor of sociology at the University of Minnesota. They have done extensive laboratory and field work on the relationships between personality, body and behavior, and they have pooled their talent and knowledge to construct the questionnaire that appears on the following page.

PT will publish a full report of the results of this survey in a later issue as we have done in previous surveys on cities, law, drugs, sex, death, and woman & man. Together, we can dispel some of our ignorance about the way we relate to our bodies; thus the value of the results rests on our candor and thoughtfulness in filling out the questionnaire. Please put your responses on one of the enclosed self-addressed cards (there are two, to accommodate pairs), rip it off and mail it back to us by July 31. All returns are anonymous.
